Q.T.F. General rules

1. All Canadian Tenpin Federation rules apply.
2. A youth bowler who bowls in a youth league or who bowls in a youth league and in an adult league must have participated in at least two-thirds (2/3) of the youth schedule at the time of the tournament to be sanctioned.
3. All games bowled in advance (bowl-out) with valid reasons will be accepted as long as they are bowled during the youth program at a date prior to the one of the planned absence.
4. At no time will disruptive behavior be tolerated. This includes swearing, acting rude, violence and any other disruptive behavior.
5. All bowlers must respect a one lane courtesy at all times to make sure they do not disrupt the bowlers executing next to them.

Q.T.F. Tournament rules

1. All general Q.T.F. rules mentioned above apply.
2. If a bowler wants to sign up to a tournament after the deadline, a **10.00\$** fee will be added to the entry cost.
3. If a bowler cannot participate in the event for a valid reason, the committee will decide if they partially or fully refund that bowler. This is a final decision with no appeal.
4. The tournament director will make the final decision if such situation occurs.
5. In the event of disruptive behavior during a tournament, the athlete will first receive a warning but could be disqualified if their behavior does not change.
6. A bowler must be ready to execute when their name is up in order to keep the pace up but must go only when the lane to their left AND right are free. A bowler who is not following this rule will receive the following sanctions:
 - a. White Card for the first offence;
 - b. Yellow Card for the second offence;
 - c. Red Card for the third offence and a score of 0 for that frame.
7. A bowler must wait until everyone from their lane bloc is done bowling before moving their equipment to the next pair of lanes.



8. A dress code applies for Q.T.F. tournaments and bowlers who are at their third warning will receive a 10 pin per game penalty.
 - a. **Solid color**, long dress pants or dress shorts for boys;
 - b. **Solid color dress pants, dress shorts or skorts for girls. Regular skirts are no longer tolerated;**
 - c. A dress shirt or polo with a collar which must have sleeves, mock neck type collars are tolerated;
 - d. No hat or cap allowed;
 - e. T-Shirts, sports pants, sweat pants, leggings and jeans are not allowed.
9. Ball surface can be manually modified before and between games.
10. Alcoholic beverages are not allowed in the bowler's area or in the spectator's area.
11. A bowler who arrives late for a tournament will be given a score of 0 for the missed frames.
12. The athlete is responsible of verifying their scores on the score sheet. If an error occurs, it must be reported immediately to the tournament officials. If a bowler forgets to write their score, they will receive a warning. If it happens again, there will be a 10 pin penalty each time.
13. No coaches are allowed on the lanes unless the tournament rules say otherwise. This rule must be respected.
14. The use of headphones is allowed during competition.
15. All games pre-bowled with a valid reason will be accepted as long as they are bowled during another week of the youth program before the date of planned absence.
16. At no time will disruptive behavior be tolerated. This includes swearing, acting rude, violence and any other disruptive behavior.
17. All bowlers must respect a one lane courtesy at all times to make sure they do not disrupt the bowlers executing next to them.
18. In case of a difference between the French and English version, the French version will be used.



Finances

Annual Bowling center contribution

Every year, all bowling centers with youth programs must pay a 100\$ contribution. This helps cover fees for the provincial tournaments and national championship.

All centers paying this contribution will be listed on our website in the Select club of partners of the federation. The payment must be sent directly to Q.T.F.

Annual bowler contribution

Every year, each bowler must pay a provincial contribution of 3,00\$ for the Q.T.F. (usually included in the payment sent to cover CTF sanction) and a contribution of 3,00\$ for Q.T.F. tournaments which leagues should send to their local associations who will then send their cheque to Q.T.F. to simplify the process. This contribution helps cover fees for provincial tournaments and national championships.

Provincial qualifying and finals

Following the success of the last few years, the format will remain the same. Athletes will bowl 8 games on the Saturday on a Kegel Challenge pattern and the top 8 in each division will move on the Sundays Round Robin final bowled on a Kegel Sports pattern. Winners will have the honor of representing their province at the Canadian Youth Championships (C.Y.C.) in June. The second and third position of each division will receive bowling equipment.

CIBC youth/adult doubles challenge

Last year we tried something new with this event and ended up selling out all three squads so the new Adult/Youth format will be back once again this year, hoping to fill 3 squads again in a slightly bigger center. See you there!
